## REGULAR MEETING MINUTES May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024 CERRO GORDO JUNIOR/SENIOR HIGH BAND ROOM

The regular meeting of the Cerro Gordo CUSD #100 Board of Education was called to order by President Freese at 6:29 p.m. in the high school band room. Principal Neaveill reported Awards Day was held May 16th at 8:30 in the auditorium: report cards were sent home on May 16th 2024; The Science Guy was at the school on April 18th for the elementary classes, the laser show took place in the evening; a pizza party was scheduled for students who had perfect attendance during the IAR and DLM testing; Spring pictures were taken on April 19th; the students enjoyed an abbreviated matinee of the musical - Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat at the high school on April 24th; students enjoyed a hay rack ride to the fairgrounds escorted by a firefighter for activities and popcorn at Farm Day on April 25th; Neaveill attended several IEP meetings during the month of April; students who made all four quarter AR goals went to a movie at the Avon in Decatur, they saw Elemental on May 1st and enjoyed treats during the movie; PK family night took place on May 16th; yearbooks have been distributed; park days were scheduled; check out day for teachers was May 17th; every effort was made to collect fees that elementary parents owed (library fees, lunch fees and registration fees); teacher appreciation week was May 6-10 provided by the School Board, the PTO and the Elementary School Secretary; a donation from the State Bank of Bement and money from the Fannie May Fundraiser paid for the students in PK-5 to have Kona Ice on May  $2^{nd}$ .

Principal Willard reported above state averages on SAT scores; the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade science classes conducted a science fair on April 30<sup>th</sup>; Farm Day was held on April 25<sup>th</sup>; we have 7 students who will be involved with the summer school program; six JH girls track athletes made it to the state track meet on May 11<sup>th</sup>; 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls track teams finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the sectional track meet; baseball and softball has ended for the season; band and choir went to

Bement on May 1<sup>st</sup> for a band concert, we conducted our own concert on May 8<sup>th</sup>; the musical was the weekend of April 26<sup>th</sup>; all the high school students attended the Prom Promise Assembly on April 20<sup>th</sup>; on April 24<sup>th</sup>, the Chamber of Commerce filmed a commercial; Prom was on May 4<sup>th</sup> along with post prom at the high school; on May 3<sup>rd</sup>, the junior high went to Six Flags for the end of the year field trip; on May 13<sup>th</sup>, seniors did their Senior Walk through the elementary; Honors night was May 7<sup>th</sup>, we were able to give over \$35,000 dollars to 9 of our graduating seniors.

Superintendent Weidner attended the monthly ROE, Macon - Piatt Special Education, and Heartland Tech Academy board meetings in April; the district completed the annual elevator inspection requirement on April 18<sup>th</sup>; Dr. Weidner met with leaders of the new non-profit organization Sunshine Supplies for Teachers; Dr. Weidner attended the Sullivan Group Superintendent meeting on April 19<sup>th</sup>; Dr. Weidner participated in a radio interview on WHOW to discuss the Prom Promise, Cerro Gordo student art award winners, and the spring Musical; on April 24<sup>th</sup>, Dr. Weidner consulted with Secure Halo Cyber Security to learn about ways to keep the school district safe from phishing attacks, and then completed an IASA training on the budget amendment process; Dr. Weidner attended the ROE Crisis & Reunification Team Meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup>; Dr. Weidner attended the spring musical, the Sangamon Valley CEO trade show in Monticello, and the Band/Choir concert in Bement, as well as senior night for the softball team, the National Honor Society induction ceremony, and Honors Night; staff will wrap up the last day of school with a quick district - wide meeting to acknowledge the work that staff did this year, recognize their years of service, and to talk about goals for next year; Dr. Weidner met with staff on May 21<sup>st</sup> to review the summer work list and prioritize projects.
